**First Collaboration:** Wrote "If I Give Your Name," about undocumented workers killed in the World Trade Center on 9/11. It won the John Lennon Songwriting competition.

**Farthest Gig:** The De-Militarized Zone, singing "We Are One" with family members separated by the division between North and South Korea.

Grammy nominated compilation. 1st CD is Pete. 2nd CD is friends of Pete. Pat sings two of Pete's songs.



**one x 1,000,000 = change (2004)**  
Debut duo CD. "Peace, Salaam, Shalom" and "If I Give Your Name," Grand Prize Winner John Lennon Songwriting Contest.

**Biggest Audience:** 500,000 in Washington DC in a rally featuring the Rev. Jesse Jackson, Rep. Maxine Waters, Jane Fonda, Sean Penn and Susan Sarandon.

**"Singin'est Movement":** 10,000 people sang "One x One" with us to close the School of the Assassins at Ft. Benning, GA in 2002. 22,000 sang it with us there in 2006.

**Big Wows:** Pete Seeger's a big influence; we sing his songs, he sings ours. We perform with Holly Near around the country. We travel with Phil Ochs' sister, Sonny, keeping his songs alive and reminding people that songs of social justice didn't begin with the '60s and didn't end there either.

**More Big Wows:** Shared the stage with Cindy Sheehan, Howard Zinn, Medea Benjamin, Amy Goodman, Tim Robbins, Martin Sheen, the Indigo Girls, Michael Franti and Michael Moore.

**Big Studio Wows:** Recorded with Doane Perry (drummer, Jethro Tull), Clifford Carter (keyboards, James Taylor), David Amram (everything, everywhere), Gina Forsyth (violin, Bruce Daignepont Cajun Band), David Schwartz (bass, Orleans and Northern Exposure)

**Sandy's Roots:** Played Renaissance lute and knows all the lyrics to '70s and '80s pop songs. Started writing songs about women's and girl's rights while living in London in 1989.

**Pat's Roots:** Most of Pat's 5 sisters went to school at nearby Kent State University. She was 10 years old when the National Guard killed four students there. Pat went on to study visual arts at Kent.

**Big Party:** Pat & Sandy were married in your average Jewish, Cherokee, lesbian wedding ceremony in NY in 2001, a week and a half before 9/11.
